Reminder to California drivers. Many of our shippers will share in the cost of going around bad weather, usually WY and Donner Pass. We must talk to them in regards to the pay prior to making a right or left turn to going around, they will not pay after the fact. If you see a weather system coming that could prevent you from going in a straight line, please contact your dispatcher for the load you are hauling, so that he or she will reach out to the shipper to discuss the pay. Part of the sales pitch to them is that we will still make on time delivery. or worst case same dev delivery, so be certain to plan to pick up your load early, or before pull time. Its a difficult sell if we pull late, ask for out of route miles, and then deliver late. That won't sit well when they are asking why we're delivering after the due date of the load.

Happy Thanksgiving when it comes. And of course, it will come quick. We'll take all the workers we can get, and we can't thank you enough for that. We can begin to take requests for the holidays. If you need to be in other places, we very well should be able to get you there. Let us know.

A Note From Dispatch

My calendar tells me hunting season is here. That means Winter is here as well. With that comes cruddy weather conditions. That means everyone needs to become savvier with trip planning. Head out sooner, drive a bit slower, add more following distance and anticipate the motoring public to do some dumb stuff. That includes some drivers of semi-tractor trailer rigs. You may have to start to use the prepaid truck parking to ensure you can get stopped for the HOS as well. Remember that any overage of more than 15 minutes must have an annotation.

The need for the increased following distance is for adequate stopping distance without endangering yourselves or your truck. We have seen an increase in the length of time for repairs because the body shops cannot get parts. Yes, it was the other party's fault, but that does not make the truck get fixed any faster.

Be careful getting out of the units. Use the 3-point contact to get in and out of your truck. Leave your bag with your shower stuff on the floor or seat and grab it after you are safely on the ground. Do not be in a hurry, you are not going to be winning any gold medals for your triple lutz, mohawk sequence, sit spin or shoot the duck moves. There are no judges out there.

Be safe out there while driving and when getting into and out of your tractor or trailer. The most profitable accident is one that you do not have, be with the unit or yourself.
