## Winter and Warranties...

As it gets colder, make sure your batteries are tested and that they are in good condition. Make sure the water is removed from the bottom of your fuel tanks.

If you need new drive tires they are running \$500.00 to \$550.00 each. Let us know what you would like and we will make sure we get them on. Winter is the time of year where you should carry extra fuel filters with you, snow chains or tire socks, extra wiper blades, jumper cables, anti-gel fuel additive (especially if you aren't regularly getting fuel in our yard), extra blankets, food and water, and other necessary winter survival supplies,

Reminder! Extended warranties for Cummins engines increase by \$800 Jan 1, 2023. You need to let Mack know if you want to purchase an extended warranty by mid-December 2022 so you can save your hard earned money!

# **Ruiz Load Lock Policy Update**

Ruiz is taking load locks very, very seriously! They are now charging \$100 per load lock if they have to add them to a load. I'd like to suggest taking a photo of the trailer when dropped at each drop facility: Dinuba, Denison, Denton, and Florence. Be sure to get the trailer # in the photo somehow, as well some background indicating its at that facility.

If we are charged, we will track the trailer back to the individual who dropped it, and ask for that photo. If I can't provide any proof to dispute the charges, they will then be applied to that truck/driver. Remember to leave two load locks at those locations.

Also remember, you can always replenish your load locks back here at the yard. I know it may take extra time, but it is beneficial time wise to also have the convenience of the drop and hook, so please take your time and the necessary steps to save \$200

# **A Note From Dispatch**
